3) General Business, Address e-mail correspondence since last meeting

Committee members were requested to submit their ideas for CAP policies via e-mail by August 23 for consultant review prior to the August 25 meeting. The preferred approach was outlined to ensure each of the committee members go through a similar decision-making process on the policies:

- a) Review the guide that defines goals, policies and action strategies.
- b) Review existing policies provided at the 8/4/2010 committee meeting.
- c) Review additional information and links to Attorney General Recommendations, CA Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA), other suggested CAPs, workshop materials, and other relevant materials.
- d) Focus on local and City-led efforts rather than those run through a regional or State agency.
- e) Develop a list of policy ideas missing from the existing framework.

Close to 200 suggestions for either modifying existing policies or adding new policies and programs were generated.

4) Develop Climate Action Plan (CAP) Goals and Policies

Michael McCormick, from Pacific Municipal Consultants, focused on those policies that were identified as needing additional discussion in order to clarify direction to staff. A handout with a matrix entitled "Committee Generated Policy Comments and Ideas" was distributed, and the information was posted on *Horizon2035.inSunnyvale.com*.

The process of aggregating the comments and distilling them into policies will occur over the next few weeks by PMC and staff. They will also be considered in the policy development of the LUTE. The results of the discussion, combined with the results of the first CAP workshop on June 30, staff suggested policies/changes and the review of other plans and programs throughout the region will help to populate the list of policies that will be considered at the next public CAP workshop. The committee will be able to review the results of that workshop, help refine the results and provide recommendations to staff regarding policies to be included in the CAP
