Staff provided an update on the status of the Land use and Transportation Element (LUTE) of the General Plan and on development of the City's first Climate Action Plan (CAP). The Chair of Horizon 2035 Advisory Committee presented summary information on the progress of the Committee and the need for more time to carefully consider the information and policies before them.
